

Case Study: Christ Apostolic Church. 23 Highgate Road,
Kentish Town, London NW5.

During the course of a major refurbishment programme of a 150 year old large church, the contractor removed a section of decayed dado panelling, which revealed dampness affecting the brickwork to this area.

Ward Damp-proofing were asked to attend site at short notice to inspect the accessible ground floor walls and provide our estimate for damp proofing works as rising dampness was found to be affecting the majority of the ground floor walls.

The contractors were able to submit our costing to their client and architect within 3 days of un-covering the damp walls and a quick decision was reached to treat the walls accordingly.

Although additional funding had to be found to cover the unexpected additional works, the speed of our response meant that no un-due delay of the project occurred.

A chemical damp proof course was installed as required together with specialist salt resistant rendering to heights of 1200mm and full heights.
